

Media Guidelines

Social Media Advertisement:

1. **Engaging Visuals:** Use eye-catching graphics, colors, and images. The use of video can be very effective in getting people's attention.
2. **Clear Message:** Keep the message simple and easy to understand.

Paper Poster:

In-Person Event:
