Treaty Puzzle

An official agreement among two or more nations. It may include how many years it will last and a process to work out disagreements.



The first Peace and Friendship Treaty. It took three years for indigenous leaders, including the Mi'kmaq, to sign this treaty.

The length of time promised in Peace and Friendship treaties between the Mi'kmaq and the British. It repeats a word that means children.



This is the word used for the nations who sign a treaty.

Many people think the treaties between the Mi'kmaq and the British are about land. This is a mistake. The treaties were meant to create "peace and friendship."



When two or more countries work together, or are allied.

A trade partnership among countries that border the Pacific Ocean. Canada signed onto it in 2016.



The most important treaty at the end of World War I. It lasted until the outbreak of World War II in 1939.

Along with responsibilities, nations who sign treaties are guaranteed some benefits. What are guaranteed by treaties?



Along with rights, nations who sign treaties also have promises they have to keep. This is the word for what Nations must do.
